

**RESOLUTION NO. 88-19**

**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RICHMOND,  
CALIFORNIA, AUTHORIZING THE ACCEPTANCE AND APPROPRIATION OF  
\$235,000 AWARDED TO THE CITY THROUGH THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA  
OFFICE OF TRAFFIC SELECTIVE TRAFFIC ENFORCEMENT PROGRAM GRANT  
TO FUND EFFORTS TO REDUCE DEATHS AND INJURIES FROM MOTOR  
VEHICLE CRASHES INVOLVING ALCOHOL AND OTHER PRIMARY COLLISION  
FACTORS**

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**WHEREAS**, the State government has made funds available through the State of California Office of Traffic Safety (OTS) for the Richmond Police Department to utilize best practice strategies to reduce the number of persons killed and injured in motor vehicle crashes involving alcohol and other primary collision factors; and

**WHEREAS**, the City of Richmond is identified as a grantee and entitled to a maximum of \$235,000 with the primary goal of reducing the number of persons injured or killed in motor vehicle crashes involving alcohol, drugs, speeding, distracted driving, and bicycle/pedestrian right-of-way violations; and

**WHEREAS**, the City of Richmond Police Department will utilize best practices in specific operations to enforce vehicle code violations, provide high visibility, and utilize the media as a deterrent, to decrease deaths and injuries on roadways throughout the City of Richmond; and

**WHEREAS**, the State of California requires the City Council hold a public meeting to consider the Police Chief's request for funding; and

**WHEREAS**, the Richmond Police Chief has submitted to the City Council a request that funds, which the City will receive under the allocations, be used to reduce motor vehicle collisions involving alcohol which directly impacts citizen safety while driving, riding bicycles, and walking with the City.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, by the City Council of the City of Richmond that:

1. The City of Richmond shall accept the allocation of \$235,000 from the State of California Office of Traffic Safety (OTS).
2. The funds which the City will receive are hereby appropriated towards efforts to reduce deaths and injuries from motor vehicle collisions involving alcohol and other primary collision factors as detailed in the grant proposal.
3. The grant funds received hereunder shall not be used to supplant expenditures controlled by this body.
4. The City agrees to abide by the terms and conditions of the Grant Agreement as set forth by OTS.
5. The City Manager, or his designee, shall establish a Fund Organization/Object Code in the Munis System for the deposit of the funds which have been allocated to the City of Richmond from the California Office of Traffic Safety Selective Traffic Enforcement Program Grant.
6. The Police Department Accountant of the City of Richmond shall submit the necessary reports and summaries which are required by State law.
