

## MUNICIPAL ELECTIONS & VOTER REGISTRATION

Californians must be registered to vote at least 15 days before an Election date. Registration can be accomplished online at <a href="http://www.cocovote.us/current-election/">http://www.cocovote.us/current-election/</a> or is also available at the <a href="California Secretary of State">California Secretary of State</a> website. Registration forms are also available at any Department of Motor Vehicle office, most post offices, public libraries, and at Richmond City Hall. To receive a voter registration application by mail from the Secretary of State call the toll-free voter hotline at (800) 345-VOTE.

Registration is permanent and a new affidavit of registration need only be executed if you have changed your name, address, or wish to change your political party affiliation.

A person, 18 years of age or older and not imprisoned or on parole for the conviction of a felony, may register to vote at any time; however, the last day to registration for the **March 3, 2020**, election is **February 18, 2020** and for the **November 3, 2020**, election is **October 19, 2020**, 15 days prior to Election Day.

The City Clerk is the City Elections Official and is responsible for administering the City's general municipal elections and special elections for both candidates and measures; and processing petitions relating to initiatives, recalls and referendums.

## **Candidate Requirements**

To hold an elected office in the City: the person must be:

- (1) 18 years of age by Election Day;
- (2) a citizen of Richmond and a registered voter residing within the district holding an election when nomination papers are issued to the person and qualified to vote for the office; and
- (3) Eligible to take the Oath of Office.

Richmond Mayor is elected at large and City Councilmembers are elected by districts beginning with the November 3, 2020, election, and serve staggered four-year terms. The City of Richmond consolidates its General Municipal Election with the statewide and presidential elections held in even-numbered years. The next General Municipal Election will be held on November 3, 2020, for the purpose of electing three City Council members to represent districts 1, 5, and 6 for four-year terms. Candidates must specify which district they are seeking to represent when filing Nomination Papers.

The Nomination Period for candidates to file nomination papers will begin in July and end in August 2020, 5:00 p.m. Specific dates TBD.
